Nursery - Mrs Dobson

Theme of the Week: Five Currant Buns

This week at nursery has been full of delightful smells, sticky fingers, and joyful singing as we explored the rhyme, Five Currant Buns in a Baker's Shop through baking and music!

Baking Adventure: Our little bakers rolled up their sleeves and got busy making their very own currant buns! With adult supervision, they measured flour and sugar, mixed the ingredients together, carefully put the mixture into the bun cases and finally waited for the buns to cook.

The children were fascinated by how these ingredients transform into delicious treats. We talked about where flour comes from, what yeast does, and how baking is a bit like magic!

Singing & Counting: To complement our baking, we sang Five Currant Buns together, using props and hand motions to bring the rhyme to life. This activity helped children:

- Practice counting backwards from five
- Learn about money and simple subtraction
- Develop rhythm and memory through repetition

Each child had a turn to "buy" a bun using pretend pennies, which sparked lots of giggles and imaginative play.

What a wonderful few weeks we've had in Reception and Year 1! The children have been busy learning, creating, and celebrating the season in so many exciting ways. We ended the week with our joyful Harvest Festival, where the children sang beautifully for their families. It was heartwarming to see so many of you there, and the children were so proud to share their songs and smiles with you.

This week, we've been diving broom-first into the Halloween spirit with our class text *Room on the Broom*, by Julia Donaldson.

Reception have been exploring pumpkins—cutting, scooping, and investigating their textures and shapes. They've been cooking up spooky delights in the witchy role play kitchen, stirring imaginary potions and casting rhyming spells! Rhyming words have been a big focus, and the children have loved spotting them in their activities this week. They've also been on a shape hunt, finding circles and triangles in their environment and sharing their discoveries with great enthusiasm.

Year 1 have impressed us with their brilliant sentence writing, retelling the story of 'Room on the Broom'. They've also been exploring rhyming words and using them in their own writing. They have been learning about the inspiring artist, Alma Thomas, as part of our Black History Month celebrations. The children created vibrant artwork in her signature style, using colour and pattern to express themselves—what a beautiful display it's made!

In maths, Year 1 have been working hard on addition, subtraction, and fact families, using practical resources and games to deepen their understanding. In Design & Technology, they've designed, prepared, and enjoyed their very own fruit salads—a delicious way to learn about healthy eating and food preparation!
