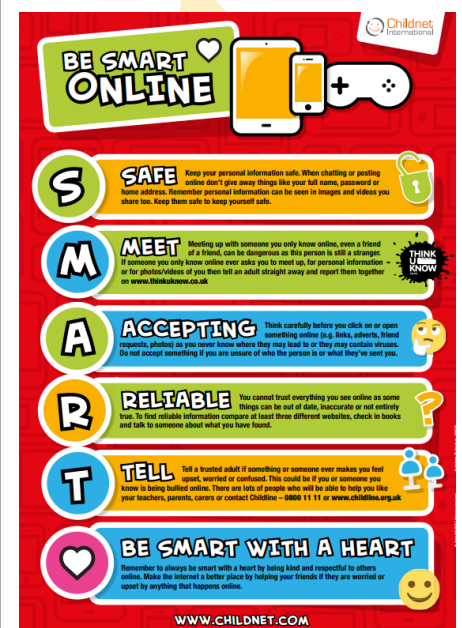

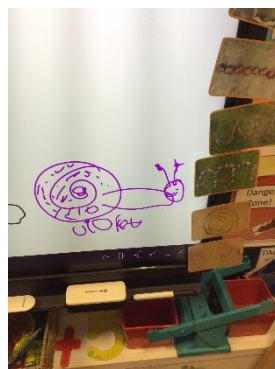

What have we been up to?



Nursery – Mrs Dobson

This week, in Nursery, the children have had a very creative and engaging time as we explored the story, *Matisse's Magical Trail*, about a snail who loves to draw. The story inspired lots of imagination, creativity, and curiosity throughout the week.

The children learned some new wonderful words linked to the story:

City – the children used construction blocks to design and build their own cities, showing great teamwork and problem-solving skills.

Trail – using special snail pencils, the children created trails and patterns across the paper, developing fine motor skills and control.

Artistic – we talked about what it means to be artistic and explored different artists, focusing on Henri Matisse.

The children loved immersing themselves in art and becoming mini-artists. They painted their own Matisse-inspired snails, experimenting with colours, shapes and patterns. It was wonderful to see their confidence grow as they expressed themselves through art.

In maths, the children took part in a Numicon snail activity, where they matched the correct Numicon shapes and blocks to numbered snails. This helped to reinforce number recognition and counting in a fun, hands-on way.

★ **A Lovely Week of Learning** - the children showed great enthusiasm, creativity, and focus throughout the week. It has been a joy to watch them explore stories, art, and numbers through playful learning experiences.

What have we been up to?



YrR/1 – Miss Humpherson, Miss Anderson and Mrs Niven

RECEPTION

Reception have been enjoying their learning all about fossils and Mary Anning, this week. They loved exploring fossils in the classroom and discovering how they are formed over millions of years.

Maths - the children have been comparing weight and capacity using scales, and measuring how much different containers can hold, using objects and water.

PSHE - Reception have been thinking about creating and achieving simple goals, learning that with effort and perseverance they can accomplish new challenges.

YEAR 1

English - Year 1 have been exploring different sentence types, with a particular focus on asking questions and using question marks correctly. This work is helping them prepare to write a short narrative linked to their History topic on the Great Fire of London. To begin this unit, they asked questions to the main character of our model text, *Sammy the Dog*, which supported them in writing a detailed character description.

Maths - the children have completed their work on place value within 20 and have now moved on to adding numbers to 20. They have been using a range of methods and practical resources to deepen their understanding.

Computing - Year 1 created their own pictograms, using Purple Mash. They followed instructions brilliantly and produced some fantastic work.

Yr2/3/4 – Mrs Garnett, Mrs Aislabie and Miss Spenceley

As we kick off another exciting week, our students have been deeply engaged with *The Firework Maker's Daughter*. We've been exploring the use of various punctuation marks, including speech marks, question marks, and exclamation marks, to express Lila's thoughts and feelings in our retellings.

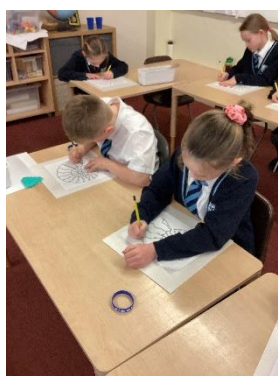
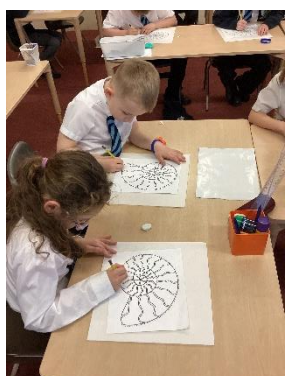
In maths, our Year 2 pupils have been mastering the art of subtraction, using base 10 to tackle two-digit numbers. Meanwhile, Years 3 and 4 have been focusing on multiplication and division, experimenting with a variety of methods to enhance their understanding.

Our PSHE lesson sparked wonderful conversations about goals and dreams. We drew inspiration from the life of Jane Goodall, who pursued her passion when she was younger, of studying and working with gorillas. This led us to reflect on our aspirations, and each student created a beautiful flower with petals representing their personal goals and dreams.

In science, we delved into the fascinating world of fossils, learning how they are formed and their significance in understanding our planet's history.

To wrap up the week, we embraced our creative sides by exploring the art of printing. Using rollers and polystyrene, the children crafted their own stunning ammonite patterns.

What have we been up to?

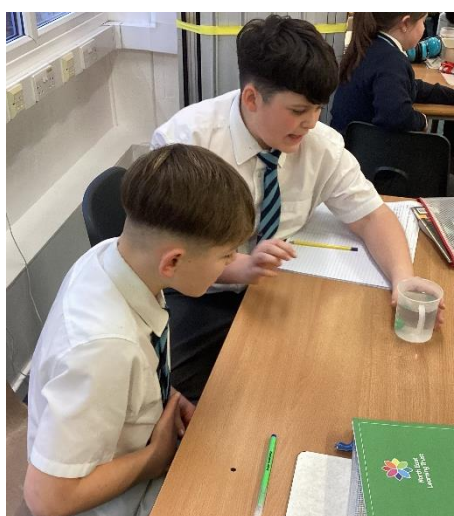
Yr5/6 – Mrs Wharton and Mrs Emery

Year 5 and 6 has been filled with curiosity this week, creativity and plenty of hands-on learning. In geography, the children explored the wide range of food produce grown here in the UK and learned how our climate influences what can be successfully grown throughout the year. Using this research, they moved into DT where they designed their own menu cards made entirely from seasonal produce that is either fresh or preserved. Some of the class favourites included comforting apple crumble, pancakes topped with fresh strawberries, and a classic chicken dinner.

In science, the children investigated water resistance using plasticine. Through careful testing and observation, they discovered that shapes with a larger surface area experienced greater water resistance, helping them understand how streamlined designs can reduce drag.

Our English lessons continued to focus on crafting a five-part narrative. The children worked hard to include figurative language to help build vivid images in the reader's mind, and it has been wonderful to see their confidence and creativity grow.

PE has been a highlight of the week, with pupils enjoying both dance and badminton. They had great fun creating their own dance routines and playing games to develop the skills needed for successful badminton rallies.
