

NURSERY

This week, our Nursery has been full of egg-citement as we explored the rhyme, "Humpty Dumpty" and all things egg-related! We sang "Humpty Dumpty" together, acted out the rhyme, and had fun imagining new endings and ways to help Humpty stay safe next time.

The children got hands-on with matching together Humpty Dumpty pictures and broken egg shapes; playing in the construction area, building their own walls using blocks and bricks - we imagined Humpty sitting on top and discussed what might happen if he wobbled! Inspired by Humpty's shell, the children explored mark-making using soft, egg-coloured paints. They created beautiful patterns with zig-zags, stripes, splotches, and spotty designs.

We had a cracking cooking session where the children helped make scrambled eggs. They carefully cracked the eggs, stirred them up, and watched them cook. It was a sensory-rich experience, and everyone enjoyed tasting their warm, fluffy creations!

Reception and Year 1

They've been using their wonderful words to describe the characters and explore how they might be feeling throughout the story — some fantastic emotional thinking and language development on display!

In addition to story time, Reception have also been learning all about night and day. Through a range of hands-on activities, they've been thinking about the different things we do during the daytime and nighttime, building their understanding of the world around them.

Meanwhile, Year 1 have had a strong focus on geography this week. Using the book *Me on the Map* as inspiration, the children have been working hard in their writing lessons to create thoughtful captions. They've also taken their learning outdoors to explore the human and physical features in our local area — a fantastic opportunity to connect classroom learning with real-world exploration!

This week has been wonderfully busy!

In English, the children started planning their own three-part stories, creating unique characters and settings while thinking about ambitious vocabulary and speech. They are excited to begin writing up their plans next week.

In maths, we've focused on estimating numbers on a number line and comparing numbers using greater than, fewer than, and equals to symbols. The engaging activities have helped the children gain confidence in their number skills.

During science, we revisited the food groups and discussed the essential functions of various food types for our bodies. The children learned how proteins, carbohydrates, fats, vitamins, and minerals support their health and energy levels.

In R.E., we introduced Judaism through a captivating video that highlighted the significance of Shabbat, and why it is important for Jews to incorporate this into their lives.

Our art lessons have involved learning about L S Lowery; sketching people and animals in his style.

Our music lessons have been a highlight, with the children learning to play the Ukulele and singing along to the rhythms, promoting teamwork and creativity.

Finally, we've been practising our times tables using Times Table Rock Stars. We encourage everyone to use this resource at home to reinforce learning.
