

What have we been up to?

Nursery - Mrs Dobson

This week, the children have been learning all about the Arctic! We've explored the unique environment, discovered which animals call it home - like polar bears and Arctic foxes, and talked about the chilly weather they experience. The children were fascinated by the icy landscapes and enjoyed engaging in sensory play that mimicked snowy conditions.

To celebrate Bonfire Night safely, we talked about how to stay safe around fireworks and bonfires.

The children made their own sparklers using rice and pasta. We also created vibrant firework pictures using paint and glitter. In our home corner, we set up a pretend bonfire where the children toasted marshmallows and shared stories – bringing warmth and imagination to the classroom!

As part of our learning about Remembrance Day, the children worked together to create a beautiful poppy wreath. We talked about the importance of remembering and honouring those who have served, and the children showed great care and respect during this activity.

















What have we been up to?

YrR/1 – Miss Humpherson, Miss Anderson and Mrs Niven

Reception have launched into their new transport topic, 'Are We Nearly There Yet?' with great enthusiasm! Inspired by the book *Emergency!*, the children have been exploring different types of emergency transport and the incredible people who help us. The role play area has been buzzing with excitement as children dress up as firefighters, paramedics, and police officers—bringing their learning to life through imaginative play.

In maths, Reception have been working with numbers up to 5, practising matching and beginning to subitise—recognising quantities without counting. It's been wonderful to see their confidence grow as they explore numbers in fun and engaging ways.

Year 1 have been busy bees this week! In English, they've been learning all about proper nouns and how these special words need capital letters. From names of people to places and days of the week, the children are becoming grammar experts!

In maths, the focus has been on 3D shapes. The children have enjoyed sorting them into groups and discussing their properties—thinking about edges, faces, and corners.

In art, Year 1 have been mixing primary colours to create secondary colours, discovering how red and blue make purple, and yellow and blue make green. Their colourful creations are brightening up our classroom walls!

In science, we're continuing our topic, 'Animals Including Humans' - with a focus on humans. The children had great fun naming and identifying different body parts, setting the stage for deeper learning about the human body.



















What have we been up to?

Yr2/3/4 – Mrs Garnett, Mrs Aislabie and Miss Spenceley

We've had a lovely week back filled with exciting learning and activities!

In English, we have introduced our new text, *The Iron Man*. The children have been captivated by the story and have focused on his character description, using similes to vividly bring him to life in their writing. It's been wonderful to see their creativity unfold!

In maths, Year 2 have been working diligently on number bonds and fact families, while Year 3 and 4 have made impressive progress by adding 1's, 10's, and 100's.

Our new science topic has taken us on a journey into the world of rocks. The children eagerly used magnifying glasses to examine a variety of rocks, learning to identify them as igneous, sedimentary, or metamorphic. This hands-on approach has made the learning experience even more enjoyable!

In P.S.H.E. we've been celebrating our differences and discussing how unique each of our families are. It's heartwarming to see the children embracing diversity!

Lastly, the children had an exuberant music lesson with Mr. Waite, learning how to play chords on the ukulele, and they even began to sing some Christmas songs!

Yr5/6 – Mrs Wharton and Mrs Emery

We hope everyone had a restful half-term break and is ready for another exciting few weeks of learning and creativity!

We've launched our new writing unit with a captivating video stimulus called *The Alchemist's Letter*. This magical tale is helping us explore narrative structure, character development, and descriptive language—all in preparation for writing our own imaginative stories. We can't wait to see where our creativity takes us!

Our class novel this half term is *Percy Jackson and The Lightning Thief*, and we are absolutely enthralled! The blend of mythology and adventure has sparked brilliant discussions and predictions. It's a fantastic way to deepen our comprehension skills while enjoying a gripping story.
