BE SMART ONLINE

S SAFE Keep your personal information safe. When chatting or posting online don't give away things like your full name, password or home address. Remember personal information can be seen by images and videos you share to. Keep them safe to keep yourself safe.

M MEET Meeting up with someone you only know online, even a friend of a friend, can be dangerous as this person is still a stranger. If someone you only know online ever asks you to meet up, for personal information or for photos/videos of you then tell an adult straight away and report them together on www.thinkuknow.co.uk.

A ACCEPTING Think carefully before you click on or open something online (e.g. links, adverts, friend requests, photos) as you never know where they may lead to or they may contain viruses. Do not accept something if you are unsure of who the person is or what they've sent you.

R RELIABLE You cannot trust everything you see online as some things can be out of date, inaccurate or not entirely true. To find reliable information compare at least three different websites, check to books and talk to someone about what you have found.

T TELL Tell a trusted adult if something or someone ever makes you feel upset, worried or confused. This could be if you or someone you know is being bullied online. 

EYFS – Miss Anderson and Mrs Dobson

NURSERY

This week, we have been reading the story, 'Kipper Beach Ball'. We have talked about the new wonderful words of the week, which included: wrinkly, bouncy, nozzle, cliff and plasticky. The children practiced their fine motor skills by using tweezers to pick up cornflakes and put them into bowls. The children used their creativity skills to design their own beach balls and have practiced their repeating patterns skills on the smartboard, with a large beach ball. The children also used playdough to make dog biscuits for kipper to eat and counted how many they had made. For snack the children enjoyed having cornflakes like Kipper!

RECEPTION

This week, our class story has been, 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Rescue'. The children enjoyed seeing Mr Grinling on an adventure again, saving the whale that washed up on the beach. They even wrote a thank you card to Mr Grinling, for helping the whale back to sea.

In maths, we have covered propositional language. The children went on a shell hunt in the reception garden and drew the shells on their maps in the correct place. The children then described where they found the shells, using above, below, left and right. They have also made 3D shapes and described where each part was, using propositional language. To tie in with maths, on our afternoon sessions the children have sang and danced the Hokey Cokey, correctly using their lefts and rights. The children have also continued their learning about lighthouses and looked at lighthouses from different countries.

Y1/2 – Mrs Garnett, Mrs Aislabie and Miss Spenceley


What an exciting week we've had in school! In our English lessons, the children have truly embraced their creativity, by participating in a hot seating activity in the character of Grandma, from our text, 'The Great Storm Whale'. The responses led us to develop a rich and vivid character profile for Grandma, showcasing their imaginations and understanding of character development. It's been wonderful to see them step into her shoes!

Meanwhile, in Maths, Year 1 have been focused on engaging with number patterns. The students have been practising recognising patterns in numbers and using them to solve problems. Year 2 have been learning about volume and how to measure different capacities and compare their sizes. The children are making great strides in their mathematical understanding, and it's fantastic to see their confidence grow with each new concept!

In our science lessons, we've taken a fascinating journey into the world of animal adaptations. The children have explored how specific animals have evolved to suit their habitats, discussing examples such as a polar bear's thick fur for cold environments or the long neck of a giraffe for reaching high leaves. This topic has sparked lots of interesting discussions as students share their thoughts and insights about the natural world around us!

In Design Technology, we've been busy learning to stitch, and the children are really getting the hang of it! They've started making their very own pouches, which has proven to be a delightful project. It's heartwarming to see their enthusiasm as they sew, and they are showing great patience and attention to detail. We look forward to seeing their finished products!

As we approach Father's Day, the children have been busy making a little craft to give to their special person. We hope that all the dads/special people have a lovely day celebrating with their loved ones.

Year 3 and 4 have carried on with a wonderful start to the final half term of this school year. Creating some fantastic work on their narratives in English, using lots of past tense and figurative language. They have really blown me away with their prior knowledge on the different techniques, and everyone has enjoyed practicing them and putting them into their work.

We finished off the Egyptian artwork piece and they all really enjoyed creating their own death masks and then getting messy with teabags to create that aged look! Next, is the DT project for pyramids and I think it's safe to say we are all looking forward to this one!

Continuing on that more practical theme, we have delved further into the idea of sound being carried via soundwaves, by experimenting on how we can best absorb these soundwaves with different materials. This meant lots of fun creating various noises and using a selection of materials such as boxes, pans, paper, bowls, clothes etc... to inhibit or amplify these. As always, the class embraced this and we recorded some unexpected results.
