We have been a registered charity for almost 34 years, and we don't want to see it have to come to an end!



#### NURSERY

This week in Nursery, we've been singing and learning all about Old MacDonald had a Farm!

This week, the children had a fantastic time celebrating European Day of Languages!
They enthusiastically practised saying "Hello" in Italian ("Ciao!"), tasted some
delicious Italian pizza and proudly created their own Italian flags.

#### Reception

In literacy, Reception continued exploring the lovely story, *Perfectly Norman*. The children used their Wonderous Words to describe how Norman felt about having wings—thinking deeply about his emotions and growing confidence.

In maths, they had fun making patterns using different objects, and began matching quantities to numbers, laying strong foundations for their number work.

#### Year 1

Year 1 have been exploring their place in the world in geography. They learned about where we are on the globe and started using compasses to understand direction—a great introduction to map skills! In maths, the children have begun to partition numbers, helping them prepare for future work on addition and subtraction.

In science, they explored the similarities and differences between animals, building their observation and comparison skills.

The children have also enjoyed logging into their PurpleMash accounts, becoming more confident in navigating the website and exploring its fun and educational activities.

### Yr2/3/4 – Mrs Garnett, Mrs Aislabie and Miss Spenceley

What a busy and exciting week we have had! This week, the children have been diligently working on writing their own descriptive cave settings. They've been using expanded noun phrases, a rich range of vocabulary, and conjunctions to enhance their sentences. It's wonderful to see their creativity flow!

In maths, we've been focusing on counting in various intervals, including hundreds, thousands, and tens of thousands. The children are becoming quite adept at this, and it's fantastic to witness their growing confidence in number work.

As part of our history topic on the Stone Age, we delved into the evolution of houses. The children enthusiastically embraced the hands-on aspect of our learning, by building their very own models using clay, string, and small sticks. The results were impressive and showcased their imaginative designs!

To top off the week, we celebrated the European Day of Languages. We explored Germany, learning about their language, numbers, famous buildings, and, best of all, their delightful cuisine. The pupils even had the chance to taste some German sweets—who knew Haribos were from Germany?

### Yr5/6 - Mrs Wharton and Mrs Emery

This week, we've been diving into the world of non-chronological reports. We have explored the key features that make this text type so effective – from clear subheadings and factual language to technical vocabulary and labelled diagrams. We also began researching for our own reports using an exciting topic: The Eden Project. The children have been fascinated by the incredible biomes and sustainability projects based in Cornwall and have been gathering facts ready to write their own detailed reports next week.

In geography, we continued our study of biomes. The children carried out independent research on different global biomes – from deserts and rainforests. Their knowledge will come in handy next week when we begin creating our own miniature biome in a shoebox! We can't wait to see the creativity and understanding come to life in 3D form.

Our DT focus this half term is on pneumatics. This week, the children used their imaginations and problem-solving skills to plan a pneumatic model of their own design. From moving monsters to helpful machines, we can't wait to begin building these, next week!

Friday was our celebration of European Day of Languages, and our class focused on Greece. We learnt some basic Greek words, explored the culture, and – of course – enjoyed tasting some delicious Greek food, including tzatziki, taramasalata, olives, feta cheese, and pitta bread.

A huge well done to our brilliant cross-country runners and basketball players who represented Middleton-in-Teesdale Academy so proudly this week. Both teams played with great spirit and teamwork – and we're thrilled to say that one Basketball team even brought home a gold medal! What an achievement!
