EYFS – Miss Anderson and Mrs Dobson

NURSERY

This week, the children have had lots of fun learning all about the seaside. We have looked at different types of beaches, such as pebbly and sandy, what we might do at the seaside and we talked about our own trips to the seaside. We also discussed the different types of creatures which live in rockpools and we then made our own rockpool in Nursery, for our children to explore.

The children have enjoyed acting out this weeks' wonderous words, which included: flapping, scuttling, pecking and leaping. The children made their own collage rockpool and added crabs, shells and seaweed. We have also been practising counting, by rolling a dice and collecting the right number of dolphins. During Careers Week, the children have had visits from a vet, a physiotherapist and a gamekeeper, and to end the week, the children dressed up as what they would like to do when they grow up.

RECEPTION

What an exciting week we've had! For Careers Week we have had some amazing visitors. The children were first visited by a Raby Estates gamekeeper, where the children learnt about what animals the gamekeeper's look after and how they treat the land to create an ideal habitat for rare animals. They also got to see and sit in the buggy that they use to move around the fells. We met two vets, where we learnt about what vets do to look after poorly animals in different situations. The children got to practise using a stethoscope, bandaging a dogs leg and we looked at real x-rays. We were also visited by a physiotherapist that taught us what the job role is and the different ways that you can help people to move safely and comfortably. The children learnt about the different joints in the body and how they work together to move our body. Pupils then had a turn at moving with crutches and a walking-frame, to see how this helps people to move around comfortably. Finally, we have dressed up as what we would like to be when we are older! The children have really enjoyed sharing their hopes for their future career with their friends and role playing in their costumes.
