

Nursery – Mrs Dobson

This week, in Nursery, we've continued our exciting journey through the Arctic! The children have been learning all about polar bears – did you know they are strong, huge and have a thick layer of blubber to keep them warm? We have been fascinated by their long bodies and powerful presence in the icy wilderness.

To bring the Arctic to life, the children have enjoyed sensory play, creating icebergs using real ice and ice bricks. It's been wonderful to see their imaginations flourish as they explored this chilly habitat. We have also been busy drawing polar bear pictures and sharing fun facts to help us remember everything we've learned.

In addition to our Arctic adventures, we took time this week to remember our soldiers. The children made a beautiful poppy wreath to be taken to the Cenotaph as a mark of respect. We are incredibly proud of how well Nursery participated in the two minutes' silence – a truly touching moment of reflection.





What have we been up to?

YrR/1 – Miss Humpherson, Miss Anderson and Mrs Niven

This week, the children have truly been wild things! Our class text, Where the Wild Things Are, has captured their imaginations. Together, they sailed across the sea to where the wild things live and joined in a wild rumpus! Reception have been using this week's Wonderous Words to create sentences describing the wild characters. Year 1 have worked hard to create story maps and explored Max's feelings throughout the story, preparing to write their own retells.

In maths, Year 1 have been investigating 2D shapes, learning their properties, and sorting them into groups. Reception have focused on numbers up to 5, matching different representations and learning the concept of 'one more'.

In science this week, Year 1 explored the sense of taste as part of their Humans topic. They had great fun blind-tasting different flavour groups and discussing their experiences.

This week was Anti-Bullying Week and the children learned about how bullying can happen online. They reflected on ways to stay safe and kind in the digital world, and the best ways to deal with difficult situations based on scenarios they had been given.









What have we been up to?

Yr2/3/4 - Mrs Garnett, Mrs Aislabie and Miss Spenceley

This week has been an exciting one for the children as they delved into the story of The Iron Man.

They set the scene beautifully by creating a vivid character setting, employing fronted adverbials and thought-provoking questions to convey a sense of caution throughout their narratives.

In maths, our Year 2 pupils have been exploring the relationship between addition and subtraction, really getting to grips with the concepts. Meanwhile, Year 3 students have been adding 10 to hundreds, tens, and ones, which has certainly strengthened their number skills. Year 4 have also been focusing on addition but have taken it a step further by practising the exchange method - well done, everyone!

In history, the children compared the similarities and differences between Stone Age and Iron Age tools, discovering how these innovations allowed people to settle during the Bronze Age. It was a fascinating exploration of our past.

To round off the week, we joined in the fun for Children in Need! The children participated in Joe Wicks' Live Activate session, an energetic and challenging workout that left everyone breathless - definitely an exhausting, but enjoyable experience! A heartfelt thank you to all the parents and children who generously bought raffle tickets and baked delicious cakes for this worthy cause.

Yr5/6 - Mrs Wharton and Mrs Emery

This week Year 5/6 has been full of creativity, curiosity, and kindness. On Monday, we explored the fascinating world of Greek gods and goddesses, researching their stories before presenting our findings to the rest of the class. The children showed great confidence in sharing their knowledge and enjoyed learning from one another.

On Tuesday, we took inspiration from our history work and channelled it into art. The children designed and painted Greek-inspired plates, producing imaginative and colourful designs that reflected the myths and legends we had studied. Their creativity really shone through in this activity.
