

The children loved exploring this wintery tale and even designed their own Pom-Pom hats for Betty what a fantastic display of imagination! We also discovered some wondrous words from the story:

The children enjoyed discussing what these words mean and how they make the story come alive. To bring 'jingle jangle' to life, we experimented with different instruments to create fun, jingling sounds. It was a noisy but joyful activity!

What have we been up to?

YrR/1 – Miss Humpherson, Miss Anderson and Mrs Niven

The arrival of the Kindness Elf has brought daily excitement to our classroom! Each morning, children have eagerly looked for where the elf might be hiding and what kind message or challenge it has left. This has encouraged kindness, sharing, and thoughtfulness throughout the week. Both Reception and Year 1 have written their letters to Santa, carefully sounding out words and forming sentences. The children were very proud to see their letters ready to be posted, adding to the festive spirit.

Reception children have been getting into the Christmas spirit with festive maths activities. They practised counting and number recognition by adding the correct number of baubles to Christmas trees and explored shape recognition by colouring the correct shapes in their pictures. They have also enjoyed making fruit kebabs as part of their learning about a balanced diet in PSHE. They talked about the importance of eating different fruits and vegetables, practised fine motor skills while assembling their kebabs, and of course loved tasting their creations afterwards!

Year 1 have been consolidating everything they've learned this term. They tackled reasoning questions, which encouraged them to explain their thinking and apply strategies to solve problems — a big step towards building mathematical confidence. Children completed their piece for this writing cycle - a recount of a science lesson about sound. They practised using time connectives (first, next, then) and descriptive detail to make their writing clear and engaging.

The class explored toys from the past in history, comparing them with modern toys. They discussed how materials, designs, and play have changed over time, sparking curiosity about life in different eras.

Finally, Year 1 investigated their sense of smell, correctly identifying a range of scents. This hands-on activity helped them understand how our senses work together and why they are important in everyday life.

Yr2/3/4 – Mrs Garnett, Mrs Aislabie and Miss Spenceley

What a delightful week we've had at school! Our class elf, Tinsel, joined us this week, bringing a sprinkle of magic and a touch of mischief. Tinsel has been keeping a close eye on the children, ensuring they stay on the nice list!

Further excitement erupted this week, when we received reports that the Iron Man has been lurking around the school, searching for metal to munch on! Mr Burnip even caught a glimpse of him! To help in our quest to locate this curious character, the children created a fantastic 'WANTED' poster. These will be placed around the school to help with the capture if the Iron Giant!

During maths, our Year 2 students have been busy mastering addition and subtraction across 10, while Year 3 focused on subtracting two numbers. Year 4 have been exploring the concept of area, and it's wonderful to see their progress.

This week, we also continued our R.E. lessons, diving into the Jewish festival of Rosh Hashanah. We discussed how this celebration is observed by both Orthodox and modern Jews, fostering a deeper understanding of diverse cultures.

During our PSHE lesson, we examined various scenarios to determine whether they represented bullying or not. The discussions were insightful, and the children shared thoughtful ideas on how to handle each situation.

Lastly, our students have been working diligently on their lines and carols for the upcoming Pathway Service next week. We can't wait to see you there!
