BE SMART ONLINE

S SAFE Keep your personal information safe. When chatting or posting online don't give away things like your full name, password or home address. Remember personal information can be seen in images and videos you share too. Keep them safe to keep yourself safe.

M MEET Meeting up with someone you only know online, even a friend of a friend, can be dangerous as this person is still a stranger. If someone you only know online ever asks you to meet up, for personal information or for photos/videos of you then tell an adult straight away and report them together on www.thinkuknow.co.uk.

A ACCEPTING Think carefully before you click on or open something online (e.g. links, adverts, friend requests, photos) as you never know where they may lead to or they may contain viruses. Do not accept something if you are unsure of who the person is or what they've sent you.

R RELIABLE You cannot trust everything you see online as some things can be out of date, inaccurate or not entirely true. To find reliable information compare at least three different websites, check in books and talk to someone about what you have found.

T TELL Tell a trusted adult if something or someone ever makes you feel upset, worried or confused. This could be if you or someone you know is being bullied online. What have we been up to?



EYFS – Miss Anderson and Mrs Dobson

NURSERY

This week's story has been, 'Night Animals', which is all about nocturnal animals, what they eat and where their habitat is. The fox and the hedgehog were the favourite animals with our children. The children have enjoyed making a transient art fox picture, using natural materials such as leaves, pinecones, sticks, etc. We have also looked at people who work at night time, such as nurses, taxi drivers and pilots. Here the children had a go at sorting different jobs into night and day.

RECEPTION

This week Reception have learnt about emergency vehicles. We have looked at fire engines, police cars, lifeboats, and ambulances. We have discovered what these vehicles are for and how the people who drive them help us.

In maths, the children have been focusing on number 4. We have made 4 in different ways and used a whole part model to show number bonds to 4.

Reception have also investigated to find magnetic materials around the classroom. The children each took a magnet around the room and tested various objects for magnetic properties. They had lots of fun hunting for magnetic things!





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What have we been up to?

Y1/2 – Mrs Garnett, Mrs Aislalie and Miss Spenceley

In English, we have continued to focus on our text – Jack and the Beanstalk. This week, we have been writing a beginning, middle and end using the past tense, expanded noun phrases and exclamation marks. A golden egg also appeared in our classroom..... we are still wondering where it came from!

In our maths lesson, we have been learning how to subtract. We have discussed a range of vocabulary to recognise when we need to subtract. Year 1 have been subtracting using images, crossing out and making number sentences. Year 2 have used a range of methods to subtract, including finding ten from a 2-digit number, using a number line and the column method.

Throughout the week, we have also supported Anti-bullying Week by looking at the chosen theme Choose Respect. We discussed what respect means and how we can show it, hear it and feel it. Then we made a class paper chain, each one showing how we can show respect. We also had fun wearing odd socks which encouraged children and adults to express themselves, celebrate their individuality and highlighting what makes us all unique!

Our science lesson this week has consisted of learning about life cycles of animals and humans. We talked about how animals and humans can all have offspring, but they may have different names, look different and that their life cycle may also be different. We completed life cycles of different animals and compared how they are born and develop.





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What have we been up to?

Y3/4 – Miss Humpherson and Mrs Niven

It has been a very busy week this week, full of lots of exciting events and fund-raising for Children in Need. There were lots of fabulous cake donations made for our Children in Need Bake-Off and we were able to raise lots of money for the charity, which is amazing. Thanks so much for all your efforts and support!

The children have been looking at 'respect' for Anti-bullying Week this week, and wore their odd socks in support of standing up against bullying. In our online safety lessons, we have also been looking at how people can be bullied online and how we can spot if someone might be experiencing bullying online, and the actions they should take.


In our writing lessons this week, we have been finishing off our newspaper reports for the children of Whiffington, and these are now ready to publish next week.

In maths, we have been practicing our multiplication and division facts, and getting ready for our next topic using these basic skills to answer more difficult calculations.

In geography, the children looked at the journey of a river, working in small groups to draw their own rivers, labelling all of the different parts of the journey. This was in connection to the water cycle they have been learning about in science.

We have been getting creative in our DT lessons and learning the skills to carefully cut, score and fold, to create a prototype of a box with an opening lid for our precious items. The children also experimented with different shaped boxes.

In PE, the children have been learning how to perform rolls correctly and safely, and many of the children were pleased to be able to do a backwards roll without any support.





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

Y5/6 – Miss Dobinson and Mrs Emery

This week, we have celebrated Anti-bullying Week, completing a range of activities, including our odd-socks day on Tuesday! This year's theme is to be respectful, and so we measured how respectful children are in the classroom; we created a respectful chain reaction by decorating our own dominoes and wrote a story which portrays respect and kindness.

Aside from this, we have finished our first writing unit of the half-term, a diary entry from Fred. All children have really thought about the character's emotions as they have written, creating impactful diary entries.

In science this week, we investigated how voltage affects the brightness of a light bulb. We found that by adding more volts, the bulb became brighter. It is great to see so many budding electricians!

On Friday, we had a SPOTacular day as we completed Children-in-Need activities. We loved all of the children's spotty outfits and the effort that they put in to their cakes!
