NURSERY

This week we have been learning the nursery rhyme, 'There was an Old Lady who Swallowed a Fly'. The children have loved this song and found it funny that she swallowed all the animals. The children have learnt new wondrous words including, imagine, swallowed, absurd and lurking.

We discussed all the different characteristics of the many animals that the old lady swallowed. The children then used pipettes to help melt ice-cubes, which contained flies (laminated pictures), to feed the old lady. We made lists of all the different animals, ordered the animals and finally, we made a proper meal for the old lady!

YrR/1 – Miss Humpherson, Miss Anderson and Mrs Niven

We have had a productive couple of weeks in Year 1 and Reception class.

This week in Reception, we have been enjoying the story, 'The Smartest Giant in Town'. The children have excelled at sequencing the events of the narrative and learning their key vocabulary. In mathematics, they have engaged in sorting and comparing a range of items and have been looking at comparing the biggest and smallest objects.

In Year 1, Design Technology lessons, the children have engaged their senses to explore a variety of fruits, discussing their distinct tastes, aromas, and textures. In English, the pupils have been developing their writing skills by composing captions that reflect their observations.

During mathematics, we have focused on the concept of 'one more' than a given number up to 10, and the children have demonstrated their understanding by sorting items in various ways.

Additionally, our Physical Education sessions with our P.E. coach have centred on enhancing fundamental skills, contributing to their overall physical development.

In science, we commenced our topic on 'Animals Including Humans', by discussing the pets that our children have at home. This led to the creation of a tally chart to chart the different types of animals present in our class.

Yr2/3/4 - Mrs Garnett, Mrs Aislabie and Miss Spenceley

This week, we have embarked on an exploration of the new text, 'Stone Age Boy', a captivating story that transported the children back to prehistoric times. The children were completely engaged, asking thoughtful questions about the characters and plot, and making predictions on what might happen next. Their enthusiasm for the story has inspired us to delve deeper into the vocabulary, as we examine the meanings behind key terms. It's been a joy to witness their eagerness to expand their language skills!


In Maths, we put our thinking caps on as we tackled the place value of numbers up to 20, 100, and even 1000. The children recapped the concept of partitioning, which has proven invaluable in helping them understand how to break numbers down into their component parts. They worked on various activities that solidified their understanding, and it was encouraging to see them apply this knowledge confidently.

During our PSHE sessions, we took the time to reflect on our personal goals and celebrate our achievements so far this year. The children passionately discussed what they hope to accomplish and designed their own medals as a visual representation of their targets. These medals will serve as rewards once they meet their objectives, fostering a sense of pride and motivation.

In history, we explored timelines and the significance of AD and BC. The students enjoyed placing various historical events in chronological order, which laid the groundwork for our upcoming topic on the Stone Age. It's a fascinating period that they are looking forward to learning more about.

In science, we shifted our focus to food and nutrition, using the example of Usain Bolt to spark discussions around diet and its impact on performance. The children were intrigued by his eating habits and the reasons behind them. This has prompted them to think critically about their own nutrition choices.

Lastly, we had our very first ukulele session with Mr Waite, our music teacher. It was a delightful experience that introduced the children to music in a fun and engaging way!

Yr5/6 - Mrs Wharton and Mrs Emery

This week, we have continued to have lots of fun in a range of lessons, and Mrs. Emery and I have been blown away with the level of focus and dedication to handwriting and presentation in all lessons.

This week, we have begun our writing unit; writing a letter based on the book, 'Tom's Midnight Garden'. So far, the class are curious about what Tom will find in the midnight garden.

We have also started our first DT unit of the year; Dart Frogs. In this unit, we will be making a pneumatic device. During our first DT lesson, we had great fun investigating how pneumatic devices work, by using only 3 simple objects: a plastic bottle, a balloon and a book. Why not ask your child how the investigation went!

In geography this week, we reminded ourselves of the lines of latitude and longitude, before exploring different climate regions of the world. We remembered that we live in a temperate climate, whereas countries near the Equator have a more tropical climate.

On Thursday we were excited about our first music lesson with Mr. Waite, from Durham Music Service. In this session, the class learnt how to hold and play the ukulele, before then performing a song.
